During his youth, his nobility of soul, purity of heart, his strict adherence to truth and honesty and his stern sense of duty earned him the titles of "Al-Amin - the trustworthy" and "Al-Sadiq - the true." All these examples show that Holy Prophet (PBUH) spent his youth in a sublime and dignified manner.

Modesty (Haya) means "freedom from conceit" and "improvement in dress, speech and conduct." The Holy Prophet greatly emphasized on the importance of Haya which leads to shyness and deeper modesty based on faith. According to the Rasool absence of Haya could lead a person to sinful behaviour. He narrated the importance of modesty in the following words (as narrated by Abu Mas'ud (R.A):

"If you donot feel ashamed then do what ever you like." Thus a chaste, modest and sophisticated Muslim youth is the ideal of the teachings of Holy Rasool.

The Holy Prophet (PBUH) always gave importance to youth because they are the backbone of a civilization and future of nature nation. He considered youth to be superior in their energies and capabilities.
